- 3 eggs
- 2 cups chopped zucchini
- 3 teaspoons vanilla
- 3 cups flour
- 1/4 teaspoon Baking Powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon all spice

My brother sent some photos of the old home place this winter. It's surprising few a few pictures can bring such a flood of memories. One shot showed the street up from the house. The woman woke to darkness, her mind said it was morning, but her eyes said it was still night. She sat on the edge of the bed.

"No use in getting up," her husband beside her said. "the sun's gone out".

"I must have slept too long." The woman rubbed her eyes, "I'll make your

breakfast while you're getting ready for work,"

"I'm not going anywhere." Her husband said. "Like I told you, there's no more sun."

"That's impossible." The woman knew the layout of the room like the intimate touch of her husband's hand, and she went to a window, outside was only darkness.

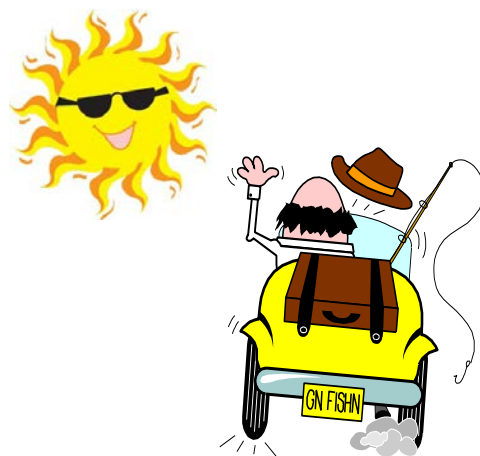
