


America the Great June Recap

Chicken & Waffles



Ingredients

- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 stick unsalted butter, melted and cooled, plus more, room temperature, for serving
- 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 4 think chicken cutlets (about 1 pound total), patted dry
- 3 cups low-fat buttermilk
- 3 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup safflower oil, plus more for brushing
- Pure maples syrup and hot sauce for serving

Directions

- 1. Whisk together eggs, 2 cups buttermilk, and butter.
- In another bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda, and 3/4 teaspoon salt.
- 3. Transfer 1 cup flour mixture to a shallow bowl; fold rest into wet ingredients.
- 4. Preheat a Belgian-waffle iron; brush with oil. Pour in 1 cup batter; spread, leaving a 1/2-inch border. Cook until golden brown, 8 to 10 minutes. Repeat with remaining batter.
- 5. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high. Season chicken with salt and pepper; dredge in reserved flour mixture. Shake off excess. Dip in remaining 1 cup buttermilk, then again in flour; repeat.
- 6. Cook in batches until golden brown, 1 to 2 minutes a side.
- 7. Transfer to a plate and serve, with waffles, butter, syrup, and hot sauce.

What About Chicken & Waffles?

Each month, residents have the opportunity to explore the culture of different countries through the "Passport Program." In honor of Independence Day, this July we're focusing on America. And what is one of everyone's favorite uniquely American dishes? Chicken and Waffles!

This unlikely sweet and savory combination has actually been around in America for quite awhile. The earliest known chicken and waffles combination comes from the 1600's in Pennsylvania Dutch country, but it looked a lot different than the dish we know and love today. In 1938, in Harlem, New York, the restaurant "Wells" became a late night hotspot for jazz musicians. They would stop by late at night after their various gigs, too late for dinner but too early for breakfast, so Wells cooked them up a compromise of fried chicken and waffles. Wells started a nationwide trend and in 1976 Roscoe's House of Chicken and Waffles opened in L.A. Over the years more places have joined and the delicious trend continues to delight hungry patrons across the US.

Cowboys

John Wayne



- 1. John Wayne was born Marion Morrison but he never liked his name (he thought it sounded too feminine). The head of Fox studios renamed Morrison, Wayne (after a Revolutionary War general) and John (because it sounded nice)
- 2. He coined the term "The Big C." John Wayne had cancer twice. In 1964 he had lung cancer and had his left lung removed. In 1979 he had stomach

cancer which eventually took his life. He called cancer "The Big C" in an attempt to make it sound less scary to the public so it wouldn't harm his public image.

- 3. John Wayne's finally won his Oscar for his role in True Grit.
- 4. John Wayne wasn't only a fan of chess, he was really good at it. He often brought a miniature board around with him so he could play on set between scenes.

Clint Eastwood



- 1. He was a swimming instructor in Fort Ord in Monterey Bay for the Army.
- 2. He was offered the role of James Bond after Sean Connery left the franchise but declined the role. He
- also declined the iconic role of Superman.
- 3. He was the mayor of Carmel, CA from 1986-88. He can boasts that he made it easier to build or renovate property in Carmel, got a tourist parking lot constructed, and added a library annex for children. He also made it legal to eat ice cream in the streets (for some reason there was a law against it).
- 4. Clint Eastwood's production company is named after his agent's bad advice. His agent told him appearing in Leon's trilogy would be a "bad step." Bad step in Spanish is Malpaso, so Eastwood named his production company Malpaso Productions.
